Some things you will need to know about items in this packet:

1. Be sure to put your student's LEGAL NAME on the enrollment paperwork. Please return to Sequim Middle School Homeroom teacher by **April 24th, 2023**.
2. **HONORS INTRODUCTION TO LITERATURE:**
 - Students who request Honors Introduction to Literature will receive a summer assignment. It will be available in the SMS Library for pick up.
3. **MATH:** Placement will be recommended by your student's Middle School Math teacher. Additional math information may be reviewed by the SHS staff, including test scores and academic history which may result in a math placement change.
4. **SCIENCE:** Three years of science are required for graduation. Incoming freshmen have three science options:
 - Integrated Science
 - Agricultural Science
 - PLTW Principles of Biomedical Science
5. **WORLD LANGUAGE:** It is highly recommended that entering freshman with less than a 2.0 GPA delay taking a world language class until the sophomore or junior year.
6. **MICROSOFT IMAGINE ACADEMY:** A required class for graduation. Students may test out of the class. Please note, passing the test does not earn high school or college credit.

The rigorous bypass test includes demonstration of skills and knowledge of Microsoft Word; Excel; Power Point; Windows; Office 365; and computer literacy. The test is difficult and passing requires expert knowledge of Microsoft Office.

The bypass test will be offered the week of May 15-19th 2023 by appointment.

Please email cditlefsen@sequimschools.org or ckleinberg@sequimschools.org to schedule an appointment that works best for your student. Please be aware, this test is challenging and meant for those who have exceptional skills in Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. Exams last approximately one hour. 7. **ELECTIVES:** If your child picks an elective that is not available we will use their alternate courses. **Please make sure these courses are selected carefully.**
